A brief history of our college

This college was named after the mediaeval poet of humanity, *Chandidas*. It was founded in 1972 in the village of Khujutipara under Nanoor police station in the district of Birbhum with the motto of imparting higher education to the rural youth.

It grew out of the long-standing desire and struggle of the people of this underdeveloped area for higher education. It was almost impossible for the local students, coming largely from economically and socially backward classes, to attend the college either at *Bolpur* or *Katwa*. Realizing their plight and aspiration for higher education, some educationists struggled hard to establish this college, defying all odds, mostly financial. The sapling they planted has now branched out in many directions, blossoming forth with colours and fragrance.

The college has, since its inception, steadily evolved in terms of its human and infrastructural resources. It is affiliated with the University of Burdwan. It breathes the natural air of human relations among students and staff beyond the boundary that prides itself in it. **The college was accredited by the NAAC in 2011 and 2016.**

We regard the students as our heart and soul. We will be the happiest people if your talents and creativity flourish under our guidance and supervision.

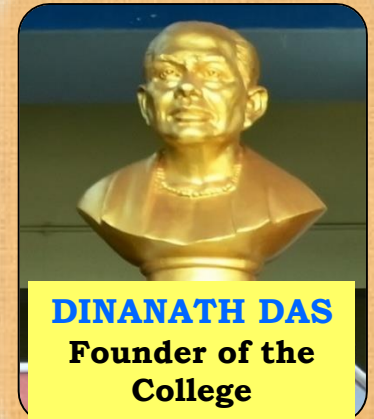

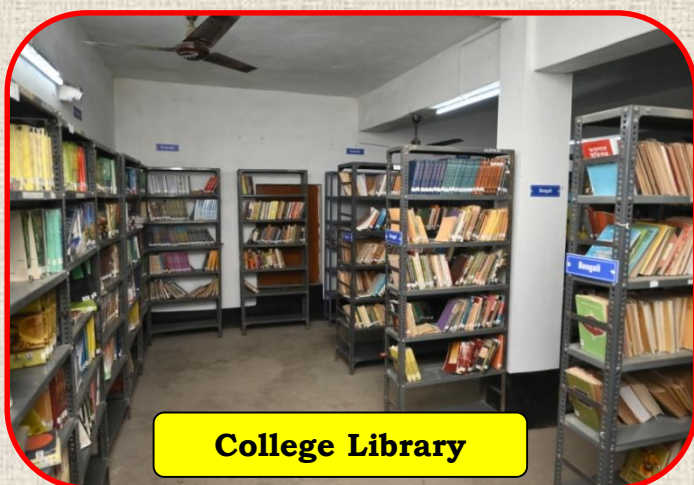


Students' Facilities



Library Facility

The college library is easily accessible. The library has open access for all its users. OPAC software and our stack staff are available to help the user search for their required material. It has a good collection of study materials: total number of Books: 23629, Reference Books (CL): 1330, Rare Books: 39. It also possesses well-equipped A.C. reading rooms both for the teachers and the students separately. 03 Computer Terminals are available for internet and OPAC facility for users. The students of the Honours courses may collect three books, and general course students may take two (2) books at a time, but they must return the books within fifteen days. All books must be returned before filling out the form for the final examination. The N-LIST program has been subsumed under the e-ShodhSindhu Consortium since 2014. All electronic resources subscribed under the N-LIST Program are available from the publisher's website, and students may use this with the requisite password to avail themselves of the E-Resource facility. Students may consult the librarian for any kind of support in the library if necessary.

STUDENT'S AID FUND

The college has raised a "Students' Aid Fund" to use as student support for academic excellence. The fund renders financial assistance to poor and deserving students. A student requiring financial assistance shall apply within three months of the commencement of their academic session.

FREESHIP

A limited number of free studentships or half-free studentships are also available to meritorious and deserving students as per the West Bengal Govt. Rules. Only those candidates may apply for these kinds of studentships who have secured at least 50% marks and attended 75% of classes. Students fulfilling such conditions, but who have not received any support from any other source, may apply to the Principal attaching income certificate from the appropriate authority. Qualifying in the test examination and attending regular classes are prerequisites for applying for a free studentship.

SCHOLARSHIP

Every year, a large number of students benefit from government scholarships such as Swami Vivekananda, Kanyashree, and the Talent Support Program offered by the college. Students are advised to go through the respective website for online applications in due time and in a proper way. Besides these, students may apply to various private organizations for scholarships. The college extends its full support and cooperation for each and every application.

AWARDS

The college offers various types of Awards to the deserving and meritorious students every year. It includes Topper in each Hons., the Best Library User, Good Code of Conduct. So talented students may have the opportunity to achieve it. These Awards are mainly offered in memory of Bhaktipada-Mayalata Roychaudhury, Promathonath, and Kalyan Roy.

NSS & NCC

Willing candidates may participate in either the NSS (National Service Scheme) or NCC (National Cadet Corps) programs that are held in the college. Through NSS, the students can take part in various social works, for example, Literacy and Adult Education programs, Blood Donation program, the observation of various nationally and internationally popular days, voluntary services during natural calamities like flood, droughts, famines, etc. The participating candidates will get certificates, which will be of great help in the future.

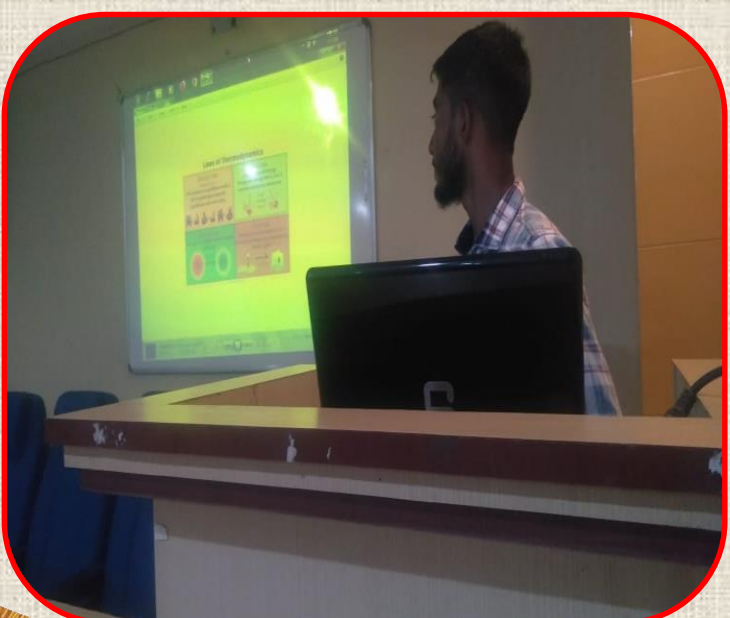
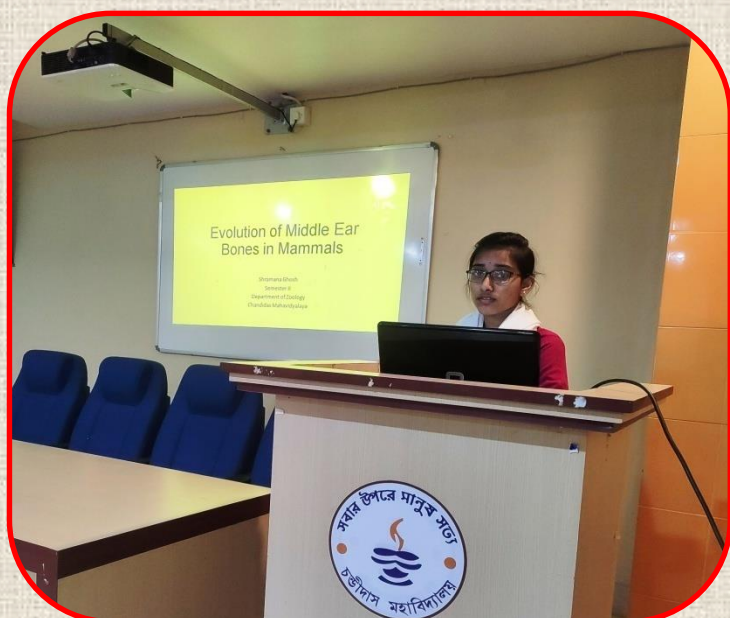
TEACHING METHOD

FEEDBACK

Following democratic ethos the college has introduced online-feedback mechanism. Students may give their feedback on the performance of the teachers, curriculum, college campus and various other issues and amenities by logging into the website. Parents, Alumni and Employer may use this opportunity through college-website's link and or through off line via drop box put in front of the office. In every year students are asked to put feedback through 'feedback form' (supplied by the college) in respect of their respective teachers' performances and other issues. Feedback 'in respect of syllabus' is also asked from the outgoing students and from Parents/alumni/ employer both through offline(drop box) and Online (college-website's link). All feedback is periodically reviewed and appropriate steps are taken in the respective body accordingly.

MENTOR-MENTEE

The college has initiated an innovative measure in the form of the Mentor system to help and guide students. In each year taking all the students of every class are grouped and listed as mentees and for each group there is separate mentor. The mentors supervise the overall development of students. Beyond the academic matter any mentor counsel for any type of personal, social or economical issue of his/her mentees. They put extra efforts for the weaker students. Advanced learners are taken care of as well.

CAREER COUNSELING CELL

College has separate 'Career counseling and placement cell' with a view to guide all the students to walk in the appropriate academic path. Students are informed about their various opportunities and different examinations inside and outside the college and different courses outside the college. Moreover, they are counseled by outside expert-career counselor to appraise various job markets and the ways to crack them. Some specific teachers take the role of this regular counseling in the separate office.

REMEDIAL AND TUTORIAL CLASSES

Based upon various tests and evaluation measures undertaken by the individual teacher and department students are categorized as 'advanced learners' and 'slow learners' and accordingly Remedial and Tutorial classes are arranged in a systematic way. So with this a slow learner is addressed through college's well established mechanism.

THREE YEAR UNDERGRADUATE COURSE

The three-year undergraduate course has implemented the new Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by the University of Burdwan since the 2017 academic session.

❖ **Session:** Every year, the 1st, 3rd, and 5th semesters of the academic session—known as the odd semesters—begin in July. Classes for the following semester will begin as soon as the final examination for the previous semester is finished, according University regulations.

❖ **Course of Study:** The B.A / B.Sc Degree course offers B.A/B.Sc. Honours and associated generic elective courses.

❖ **The College offers to teach the following subjects:**

Honours (Arts): English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Geography, Philosophy, Political Science and Economics.

Honours (Commerce): Accountancy

Honours (Science): Mathematics,

Generic Elective (Arts): English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Philosophy, Geography, Economics, Political Science and Music.

Generic Elective (Commerce): B. Com (General)

Generic Elective (Science): Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC)

AECC 1 : Environmental Studies (Compulsory for all 1st semester students).

AECC 2 : Communicative English/Communicative Bengali (Compulsory for all 2nd semester students).

❖ **Subject Combination Offered**

A student with an honours degree in a subject is required to study two general subjects. General Course students are required to study three general subjects from the list of subjects mentioned above. But it is to be noted that combinations like Sanskrit- English, Pol.Science-Philosophy, History-Economics cannot be taken together. Only one subject among Sanskrit, English and Music can be taken.



OUTLINE OF THE SEMESTER-WISE COURSE STRUCTURE FOR B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. UNDER THE CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) PRESCRIBED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF BURDWAN

Under the CBCS there are broadly two course structures, i) Honours Course ii) Pass/General Course

The main components of the courses:

Core Course (CC): A course which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement, is termed as a core course.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course, chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject of study with an intention to seek an exposure, is called a Generic Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: A course which may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study, is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): These are the courses based on the contents that lead to knowledge enhancement and consist of Environmental Studies & Communicative English/MIL. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): SEC are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competency, skill etc. It will be minimum 2 for Honours Courses and 4 for General Courses. These may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge would contain both theory and lab./hands-on-training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide the students life-skill in hands-on-mode so as to increase their employability.
