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REMEDIAL POLICY

The IQAC, in association with the Academic Subcommittee of Chandidas Mahavidyalaya, has framed a remedial policy that has subsequently been approved by the head of the Institution. In a teaching learning environment, it has often been found that some students can easily assimilate the class content whereas others are unable to comprehend much of the content being taught in class due to various factors such as inattentiveness or lack of foundational knowledge in the discipline. The class performance is usually reflected during the assessment and the students with weaker performance become frustrated that often leads to dropouts. To prevent this situation, Chandidas Mahavidyalaya has framed a remedial policy to support the weaker students academically as well as mentally so that they get their confidence back and improve their academic performance.

OBJECTIVE

The principal objective of the policy is to provide academic and mental support to the slow learners and academically challenged students.

REMEDIAL POLICY OF THE COLLEGE

1. An Aptitude Test has to be conducted by all the academic departments within the first week for the newly admitted entry-level students so that the teachers can develop a preliminary idea about the weaker and advanced learners in the class.
2. After the analysis of the first internal evaluation, the departments may start remedial classes depending upon the need.

3. The departmental teachers should follow up the performance of the weaker students and note any changes in their performance following remedial classes in the Departmental Minute Book.
4. The Mentors should talk to the weaker students individually to boost up their confidence.
5. The remedial classes may be offered for the specific modules or sections depending on analysis carried out at the departmental level.
6. Remedial classes shall be conducted with the consent of academically challenged students and without affecting the regular classroom timings (Academic calendar).
7. The remedial classes can be conducted for backlog courses as well as regular courses.
