Prof. Sengupta reminded the audience it is the Bengali language that attracted his (Vidyasagar) attention significantly. Development of Bengali letters is inter-connected with the spread of literacy. He owned a press and published lots of books and pamphlets for the Bengalees.

He was entrusted by the British government and he faithfully accomplished them.

Brian Hatcher delivered his speeches on Vidyasagar's efforts on the various types of discriminations meted out against the women in Bengal like widow remarriage, polygamy, child marriage, female illiteracy even superstitions. Prof. Hatcher deals with efforts of Vidyasagar to ameliorate the poor conditions of the women suffering from.

Widow remarriage, female literacy drive, raising the age of marriage, steps against polygamy etc.

Vidyasagar is also regarded as the Ocean of Piety (Doyar Sagar)
