Keynote Address_Speech by Prof. A S Chandel

ICT and Library are important supporting rather enhancing and improving components of education. Both play a very vital and crucial role in higher education. An ICT application in present digital era is all pervasive and commonly known to all us with its predominant use not only in academics but in almost every day-to-day activity. Day-to-day living is dominating by digital technology. Hence, life itself has become digital with its massive use. Anyone without a mobile in his/her hand today seems to be unusual and different. It has become a constituent part of our daily life. ITC enabled e-learning is becoming more popular than our traditional classroom teaching. Nevertheless, teaching and learning even in classroom environment has improved through ICT application. On-line learning is playing an important role in improving our literacy rate and overall improvement of education in quantity as well as in quality. Mobile technology is one of the heaviest used technology for various purposes including e-learning. It is estimated that there are 290 million smartphone user in India, expected to increase by another 180 million by 2021. Similarly, there will be 735 million Internet users by 2021 in India according to the KPMG Report. ICT which was once a tool has become a part of life with full dependency on it. Who is master, we or the technology? It might be out of imagination for new generation to think that there was ever a world without mobile, TV and other technology based services available to us today has made life much easier and dependent on use of technology. Keeping his influence -both in academic world and political world- our department resolved to organize a special lecture on Gandhi's Sarvodaya and it is also a topic in Under-graduate syllabus.

2) Research Opportunity in Gandhi Sarvodaya

There is a paper devoted to research methodology in 5th SEMESTER (Hons) where students have to learn qualitative and quantitative research methods. It was resolved that Gandhi's Sarvodaya could be a fit case of qualitative research methods.

The department of Political Science has resolved to organize a series of lectures to inspire the students and to encourage them. Under this initiative, the department has invited Dr. Arindam Sinha, an authority on Gandhi to deliver a lecture on the concept of Sarvodaya. Around 40 participants among whom students, teachers and former students have participated in the Special lecture. Dr. Subhas Singh Roy has initiated the programme by introducing the speaker before the audience. Dr. Sk. Ataur Rahaman welcomes the speaker and praises the initiative of the department. He believes that such a lecture is very much needed in this crisis situation. Gandhi is relevant all time in all places. When society faces any kind of crisis, we look to Gandhi for answers.

Then Dr. Sinha is invited to deliver his speech. Dr. Arindam Sinha, a serious scholar in this field, was invited to deliver a lecture. Dr. Sinha deftly handled the issue.

Idea of Sarvodaya through the Lens of Gandhi

He correlated Gandhi's idea of Sarvodaya with freedom struggle and contemporary democracy in India. According to him, Gandhi's Sarvodaya is a possible way-out of socio-political diseases of India. Countries like India need a direction of peaceful and healthy society which can be constructed upon the ideas of Gandhi Sarvodaya. He starts from western theoretical tradition to oriental tradition in order to lay out his lecture. Thereafter he carries his speech from South Africa to India and relates Gandhi's concept with the present day crisis. He expresses his faith in Gandhi to have a solution of the present crisis even in future Gandhi will be called in to resolve the crisis.

Research Opportunity in Gandhi Sarvodaya

Dr. Sinha dealt with the issues of **research potentials of Sarvodaya**. The Ideas of Sarvodaya can be used to understand individual liberty, equality, democracy, economic development, democratic decentralization, environmental pollution, racial discrimination. Even international peace and conflict resolutions can be understood through this idea.

In brief, Gandhi Sarvodaya is in this sense a treasure trove where scholars can find lots of materials to pursue **research works**.

Questions and suggestions are sought from the audience. Prof. Mojaffar Hossain Mondal, Associate Professor of Rampurhat college and DR. Rintu Kr Biswas, Associate Professor of Hetampur college intervenes with their suggestions and comments on Gandhi. Md. Hefjullah asks Dr. Sinha a question on environmental degradation and how to come out of the crisis by using Gandhi. Dr. Sinha replies to his question. He thanks the organizer for giving him an opportunity to share his views.

Prof. Aziz Hasan formally extends vote of thanks, He thanks the resources person, several teachers, his colleagues who remain present and directly helps to make this lecture session a successful one. He acknowledges the contribution of the departmental faculty members, and thanks to the students (present and former) who actively remain present through out the lecture session.

- Scientists are fighting day in and day out to curve it to succeed. Now it is an imperative part of us to search the Corpus of Vedic and Ayurvedic literature including yoga.
- So the research is that what assistance we can gather from them about disease from the context of our Sanskrit literature.
